TFFT's Scholarship Program is the heart of our mission, and every program TFFT develops and initiative TFFT pursues works for the greater good of our Scholarship Program. This program is what makes The Foundation For Tomorrow truly unique.

Each of our scholarship students is an orphaned or abandoned child who started life in one of our partner orphanages with little hope for the future. As soon as they become part of TFFT's Scholarship Program, that changes. They are still orphaned or abandoned children, but they belong to TFFT's family.



In our family, we make each child a **PROMISE**:

“We will be there for you. We will support, encourage, and guide you. We will cheer for you and challenge you. We will open your eyes to life's possibilities, and we will share in your dreams. We will be your family.”

Once part of our Scholarship Program, we provide each child with this support through their Secondary School graduation, an average of 12 years, and our team on the ground works daily to fulfill this promise. Our children attend private boarding school, and TFFT's after school Full Circle program, which focuses on providing holistic education and empowers our children to act as leaders among their peers and within their communities. Each child is also matched with a foster home, where they stay during school holidays. Because TFFT covers one hundred percent of each child's living expenses, we are able to find loving foster homes where our children develop important familial relationships, and whenever possible, we place the children with biological relatives.

Many of our sponsors also send small gifts to their students, and those who travel to Tanzania can spend time with their student in person.

We will mail your student's grade report, TFFT's detailed progress report, and a letter from your student three times a year so that you can keep track of your student's successes.
